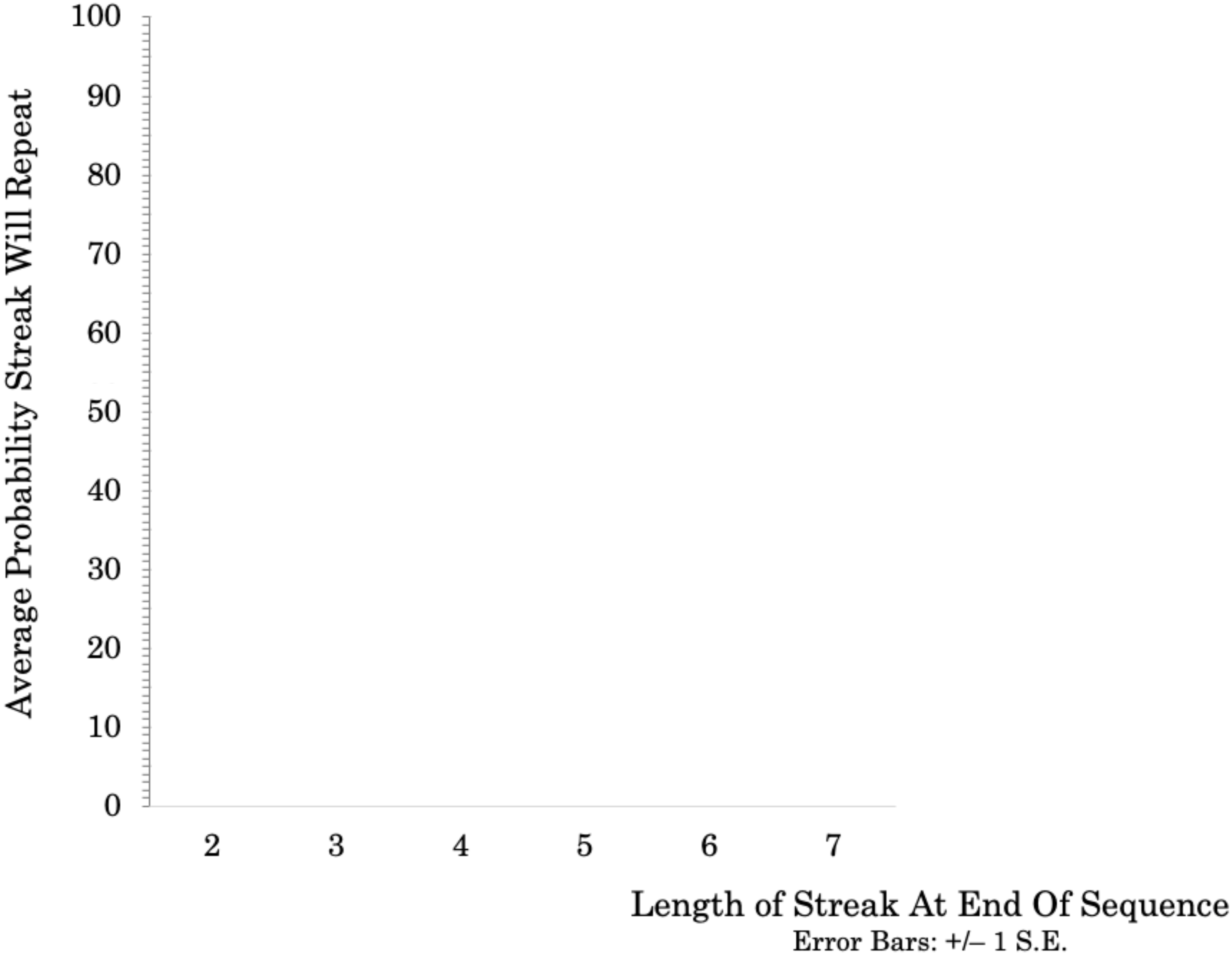
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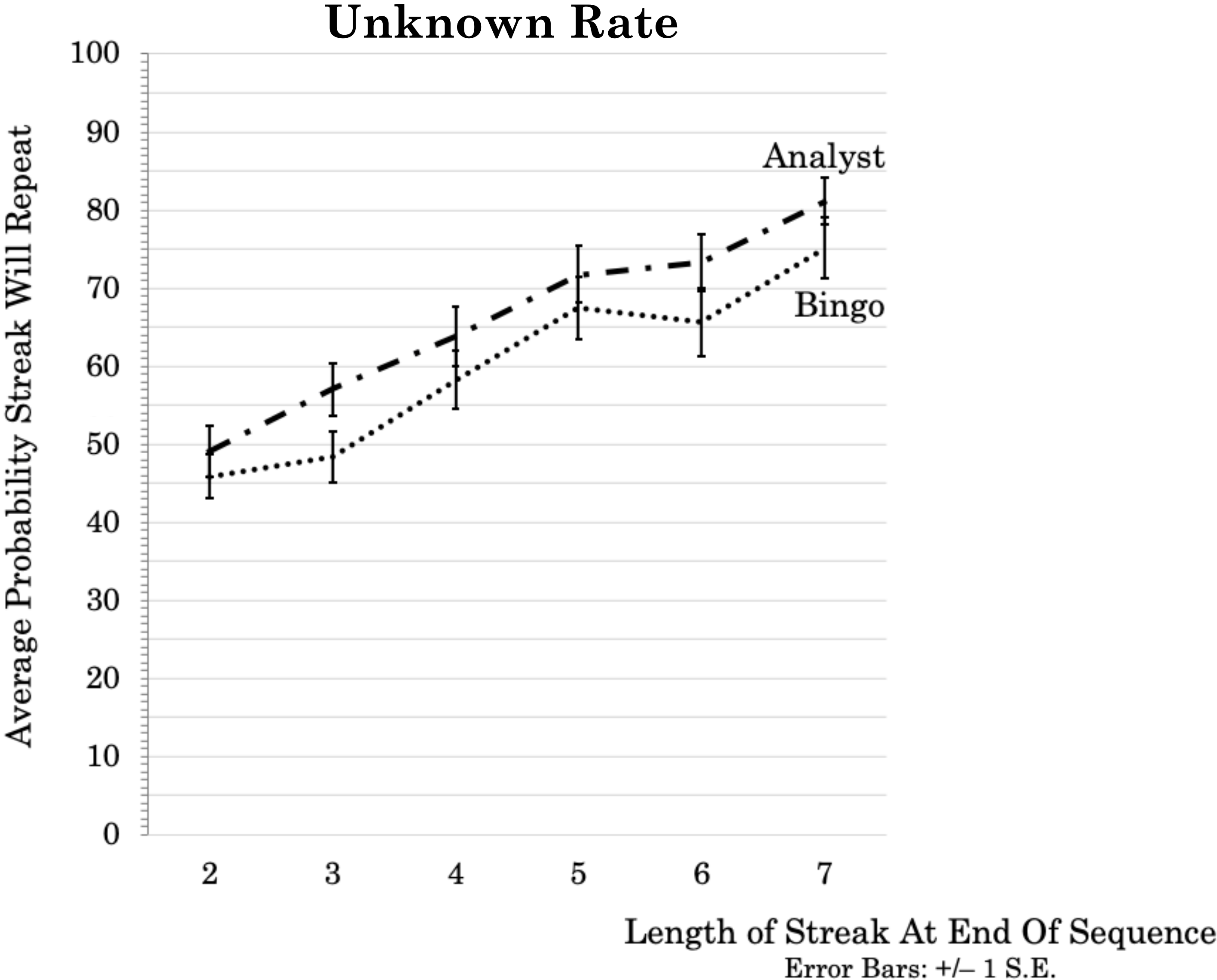
Results: Unknown Rate vs. Fixed 50% Rate

Average Probability Participants Assigned to Repetition of Streak by Terminal Streak Length



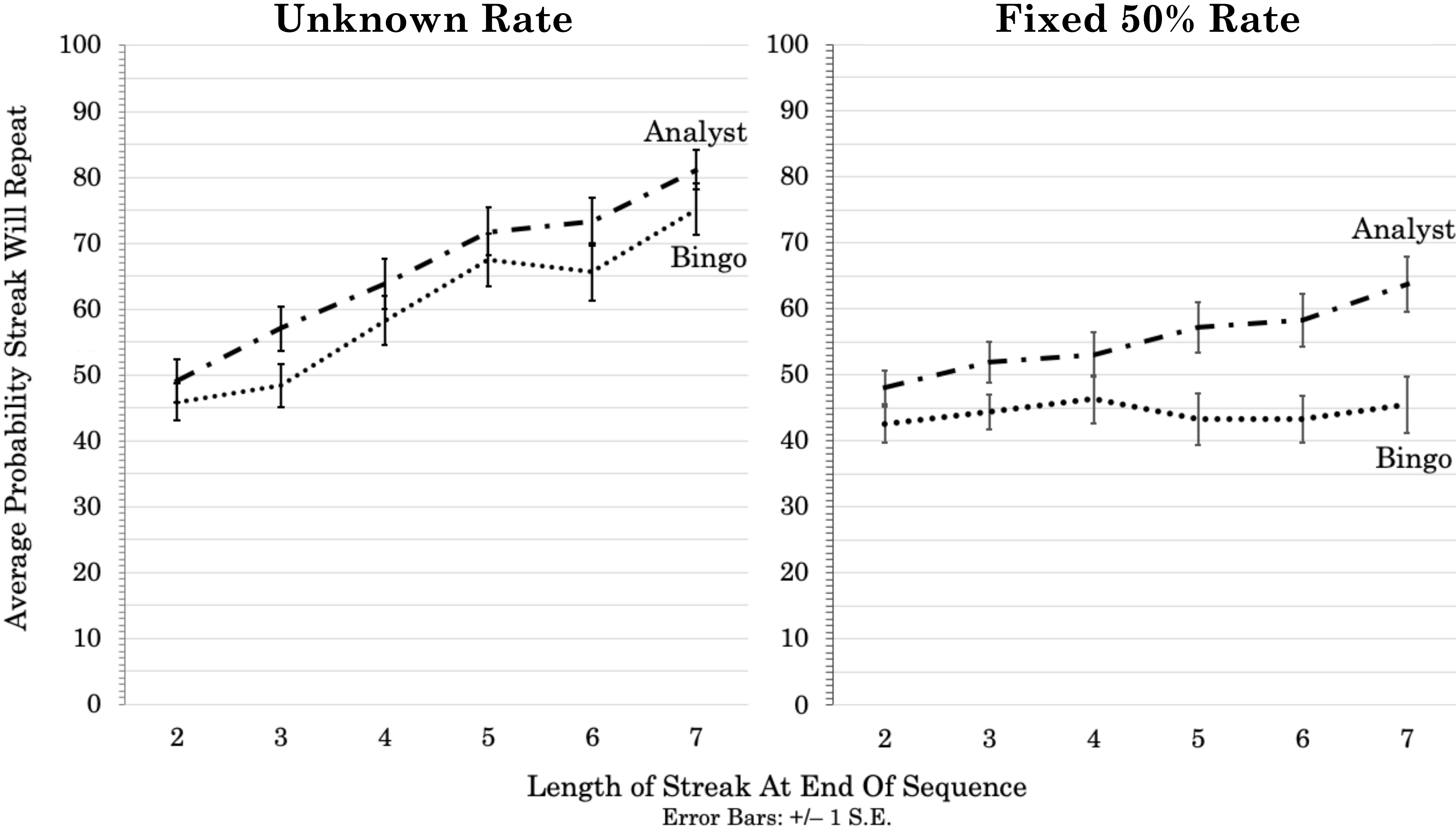
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Surprising: negative recency bias did not increase with streak length.
