SUMMARY

Witnessing Rudeness (WR) Effect on Prosociality:

- WR generally **reduces prosociality** toward others.
- Conversely, WR increases prosociality toward the target of rudeness (ToR).

Problem is ...

Many individuals the witness interacts with after WR are neither; they are uninvolved third parties who are somewhat connected to the ToR.

How will witnesses behave in social exchanges with these third parties?

Answer: Findings from four studies (N=1391) show that after WR –

- ✓ Empathy: increases prosociality.
- ✓ Distress: decreases prosociality.
- ✓ Neuroticism: bounds these effects.

Contributions:

- A comprehensive framework addressing the WR's effects on prosociality.
- 4 Highlights the impact of WR on prosociality toward third parties.


Practically:


Page Rudeness outcomes may not always harm business If handled strategically.

Main takeaway: Prosociality toward third parties hinges on the witness's emotional reaction of empathy and distress, which are shaped by their level of neuroticism.
